Welcome to South Africa



It also houses the Gateway to Robben Island where President Nelson Mandela was imprisoned for so many years. Departure

Coach departs for the Royal Cape Golf Club at 10h30 for an official match against Western Province Seniors.

The Royal Cape Golf Club is the mother club of golf in South Africa having been established in 1885 and has been on its present site since 1906. Over the years the golf course has evolved into what it is today, a classic parkland course that provides a fine test of golf as well as a wonderful playing experience. The course is in superb year round playing condition with well planted fairways, smooth greens and challenging bunkers.

Although the course is on flat terrain the playing of Royal Cape is subject to three of nature's beguiling offerings: a near constant wind to challenge you, sweeping mountain views to charm you and water features to ensnare you. Tree lined with narrow fairways and subtle USPGA spec greens Royal presents a traditional test of golf. It is a course of Championship stature which has hosted the SA Open ten times as well as many other professional and top amateur events.

After breakfast the coach departs from the hotel at 09h00 for Hermanus.

We will take the coastal route to Hermanus which offers spectacular views of the Cape Peninsula, arriving at Hermanus Golf Club for tea/coffee and snacks prior to our tee-off from 12h00.



Hermanus, on the Cape South Coast, is a charming fishing village and holiday spot famous for the whales that arrive annually from the Southern seas to calve.

Hermanus Golf Club is situated against the backdrop of imposing mountains and has views of the sea from many of the holes. It was originally an 18 hole classic country course but it was redesigned in 2006 and given a major overhaul with the addition of a further 9 holes around a real estate development and replacing the previous layout with modern classically designed holes. It is a fairly tight, tree lined course that will be enjoyed by all, especially the straight hitter.

Early Start

After breakfast the coach departs from the hotel at 06h30 for the second match against Western Province.

The King David Mowbray Golf Club is an amalgamation of two of Cape Town's famous golf clubs in 2016. The course is the old Mowbray course which is located between the green suburbs of Mowbray and Pinelands overlooked by Devils Peak on Table Mountain, just a few minutes from the Waterfront. The King David Mowbray course was originally built in 1910 and has since undergone many changes and improvements and it is widely held that it is one of the best parkland courses in the country and has hosted all the major amateur championships and several SA opens.

	The flat terrain has been compensated for by other challenges including numerous trees, water features and bunkers to keep you on your toes from start to finish. Since the Cape is windy, the course was designed with wind in mind, you will rarely find it blowing in your face or interfering at your back.

The coach departs from the hotel around 09h00 after breakfast for a 6 hour drive to Knysna in the Southern Cape with a break for lunch in the historical town of Swellendam.

We expect to arrive in Knysna at 16h30 and the group will be met on arrival by a delegation from the Southern Cape Senior Golfers Society.

Accommodation is at the 325 hectare Simola Estate which includes the Simola Hotel, Country club and Spa and 18 hotel Jack Nicklaus Signature Golf Course.

The local Seniors Committee and their spouses will host a cocktail party at the hotel at 18h00. Dress will be smart casual. The rest of the evening will be free.



Friday 17 February

Coach departs at 10h00 for the George Golf Club for a match against the Southern Cape Seniors.

The George Golf course is a beautifully manicured, 72 par, 18 hole course, with bent greens, set in the heart of the Garden Route. The course rating for men is either 68 (forward – 5542m), 70 (club – 5862m) or 72 (championship – 6162m), while that for the ladies is 72 (5204m).

This outstanding masterwork was the first Jack Nicklaus Signature Course in Africa, and offers top-class facilities to compliment the surroundings and enhance your enjoyment of your time on the course.

Sunday 19 February

Plettenberg Bay Country Club has an 18 hole par 72 golf course set in a private nature reserve and is populated mainly with indigenous flora and fauna. Monkeys, birdlife like the Knysna Loerie and woodpeckers as



well as the occasional deer make this a golf course you will remember.

The course is easy to walk, but golf buggies are always available for the not so energetic. Lush Kikuyu grass fairways and bay view greens over seeded with bent grass provides golfers with an excellent playing surface, with all year round consistency, on this parkland golf course.

This is no little seaside golf course and is a good test of golf.

Wednesday 22 February

Coach departs at 07h00 for Mount Edgecombe Country Club

Tee off from 07h45

Mount Edgecombe Country Club has two 18-hole Championship courses. The older of the two, Course One, was upgraded when the Mount Edgecombe residential estate was initially developed. Originally known as Huletts Country Club the course was designed by Sid Brews in 1936, one of the



two Brews brothers who won the South African Open Championships, the second oldest open Championship in the world after The Open itself. In 1992 Hugh Baiocchi upgraded and modernized Course One to USPGA specifications. The greens are planted with Sea Isle 2000 paspalum grass and the fairways are a strain of Bermuda grass. Several holes are protected by water- so accuracy is key for a successful round at Mount Edgecombe Country Club.

After golf – luncheon at the Mount Edgecombe Country Club

Evening at leisure. An evening stroll along the Broadwalk in front of the hotel will be worthwhile.

Thursday 23 February

Coach departs at 11h00 for Royal Durban Golf Club for the match against the KZN Seniors.

An oasis of calm amidst a bustling city, Royal Durban Golf Club is conveniently located in the heart of Greyville race track.

Royal Durban is not only unique in its setting and character, but is one of South Africa's most demanding championship courses. The length of 6115 metres could be considered a short course by modern day standards, however in Durban's humid sub tropical atmosphere it plays more like 6500 metres with little run on its lush fairways.

Coach transport to Durban Country Club at 11h00 for a match against the KZN Seniors.

A course steeped in tradition and history, Durban Country Club boasts the unique claim of being the only course on the African continent to be rated in the Top 100 Golf Courses of the World by Golf Magazine USA.

A combination of lush vegetation, sand dunes and stunning views of the Indian Ocean make this course one of the most unique, and challenging, in all the world. One of the defining characteristics of Durban Country Club are the massive undulations in the fairways, especially the 5th, 8th and 17th. The course was built on sand dunes and they are large and interesting.

Durban Country Club is a shot maker's course that you have to think your way around. Most golfers don't make use of their driver until well into their round due to the narrowness of the opening holes.

Thanda Private Game Reserve. Thanda, meaning 'love' in Zulu, is a proud member of The Leading Hotels of the World and multiple winner of World's Leading Luxury Lodge. It is known for meaningful safari experiences and exclusive close-up encounters with Africa's magnificent Big Five. Thanda Private Game Reserve is situated on a 14000 hectare Big Five private game reserve in northern KwaZulu-Natal in the area of Hluhluwe.

Safari Program: A typical day in the game reserve starts early in the morning, that's when the opportunity is greatest to see animals. Up at approx. 5:00. The 6500m par 71 kikuyu grassed course is fairly flat and offers some challenging dog leg holes whilst the finishing stretch is regarded as one of the most demanding in South Africa. You will no doubt be grateful for local advice about how best to approach the challenge the course provides which you can get from one of the members you will play with or one of the experienced caddies at the course. The halfway house at the River Club is unique in South African Golf.

The club celebrates its 50th anniversary this year.

The Royal Johannesburg and Kensington Golf Club has been the home course of the Senior Golfers Society of Gauteng for over 60 years.

Royal Johannesburg & Kensington Golf Club is one of the most prestigious golf clubs in South Africa. In its almost 130 years of existence, it has hosted 7 South African Opens and numerous other major tournaments. Royal is home to the biggest annual professional golf event in Africa, the Joburg Open, inaugurated in 2007, and is the preferred venue for the International Final Qualifier (Africa) for The Open Championship.



The Club's two courses are both highly regarded. The East Course is consistently ranked as one of the top 10 courses in the country. While the West Course, although not as highly rated as the East Course, is the preferred course for many Senior Golfers due to its greater degree of playability for golfers of all abilities.

Men golfers will join the Gauteng Seniors in their weekly fixture.

Both courses are situated on a property having 14 dams stocked with many fish varieties and woodlands inhabited by some 180 species of birds.
